Souhey is urging everyone to us a mix of vinegar, Epsom salts, liquid dawn and water to spray their weeds which should cause them to wither to appear in front of the municipal judge next month.

CITY MANAGER ANNOUNCES CUTS AND ADDITIONAL TAXES

Last month City Manager Virgil Tinzley presented a sad financial scenario to the city commissioners in a recent meeting at City Hall.

"Due to the decreasing income taxes coming into the city, we need to make several budgetary and tax adjustments and we are on course to lose approximately \$1.5 million dollars in revenue" Tinzley said.



To date the police department has reduced its

patrolling hours to 8 hours per day with a 2 hour lunch break and police officers must use bikes for patrol units whenever possible. Should an emergency occur during the lunch break, citizens may call Rachel's Donutz Dunk 'N Dip.

The fire department has also been reduced in staff by two firemen and the purchase of a new fire truck has been delayed until further tax dollars come in.



Tinzley signed an

executive order requiring the furlough of all non-essential staff for one week per month, but later rescinded the order as it also included him.

Fees for outhouse inspection have increased to \$50 per visit and \$10 per hole. Multi-family units get a \$5 discount.

Additional fees for anyone having more than two cars on blocks on their front yard or more than 3 refrigerators on

their front porch will receive a \$200 citation after the second notice.



HAPPY BUNZ CLOTHING OPTIONAL SOCIETY HAVING LOUSY SEASON DUE TO SOCIAL DISTANCING AND MASK

REQUIREMENT

The Happy Bunz Clothing Optional Society opened in late June to a limited number of campers due to the China Bug epidemic, unsocial distancing and mmask requirements imposed by Governor McDermitt Feckless.

"We used to average 2000 campers a day" said owner Orville Bunz. "Business was boomin in 2019 and we have to constantly keep our customers satisfied" said Fern Bunz, wife and co-owner. "However, 2020 has reduced our size to only 500 due to the epidemic and restrictions," she said. "We had hoped to sell a lot of drinks and sun-blocker to the golfers" he said, but the profits are slim this year.




GOLF TALES FROM THE 19TH HOLE

The essobeez need to wake up and smell the coffee!!!


