CITY MANAGER ANNOUNCES CUTS AND ADDITIONAL TAXES



City Manager Virgil Tinzley presented a sad financial scenario to the city commissioners in a recent meeting at City Hall.

"Due to the decreasing income taxes coming into the city, we need to make several budgetary and tax adjustments and we are on course to lose approximately

\$1.5 million dollars in revenue" Tinzley said. "We will need to cut several positions, out-source some services and increase taxes just to balance the budget" he stated.

The following recommendations to out-source, reduction in services and / or elimination were made:

- Building Inspection
- Septic tank inspection
- Street repair and sweeping
- Weed control inspection
- Front yard junk inspection
- Bar / Alcohol enforcement
- Police and fire departments will not work weekends
- Health department inspection
- Trash collection

Recommendations for taxation to include:

- Assessment for more than one car on blocks in the front yard.
- Assessment for more than two refrigerators on the front porch.
- Air pollution thru belching and farting tax.
- Assessment for more than 3 tires on a vehicle.
- Assessment for more than 1 Sears catalog in the outhouse.
- Assessment for more than two trips daily to the liquor store. (This tax to be applied at the store for repeat offenders.)

CITY MANAGER TO CUT POLICE AND FIRE PERSONNEL

City Manager Virgil Tinzley announced he is in the process of reducing police and fire staffing due to budget cuts. "We are cutting the police department staffing to two – the chief and a night time rent-a-cop / night watchman from Pinkerman's" said Tinzley. "We're gonna make the fire department all part time call-in volunteer to cut costs too!" exclaimed Tinzley. When asked for additional comment, Fire Chief Red Spenders said "this really hurts as we have to take up a collection from the members for gasoline to run the trucks." "Next thing you know, Tinzley will want to charge us for the water we use."

Police Chief Barney "One Bullet" McGinty was unavailable for comment.

PROGRESS OBSERVED IN SEWER CONSTRUCTION FROM FLETCHER



Wrinkle City is installing 8 miles of sewage interceptor lines from Fletcher to the Wrinkle City sewage disposal plant. "We are almost half way to Fletcher and need to finish in the next 8 months as their crappers are a-fillin up" said Mayor Alton J. Souhey. The new 6" lines will provide flush toilet service to the neighboring town of 400 who currently use outhouses. "We'll take anyone's crap...for a price" said city manager Virgil Tinzley. "We're providing the services if they provide the money" he said. "We may be expanding to St. Paris too as the St. Parisites want our services!" exclaimed Tinzley. "Crap's crap" he said.

The sewer lines will be a gravity fed system as the village of Fletcher is slightly on higher ground than Wrinkle City. "The crap will flow just fine as long as they use cheap toilet paper and not corn cobs" said Tinzley.

The project will be completed in early 2011.

BIG STORMS RIP AREA: OUTHOUSES DAMAGED

"The weeds have been pulled and our rashes from the poison ivy are finally over" said owner Orville Bunz.

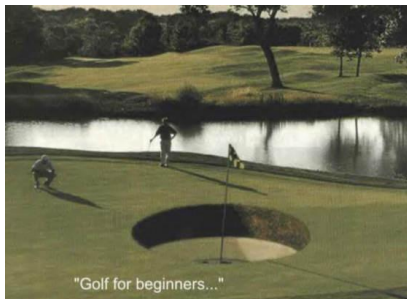

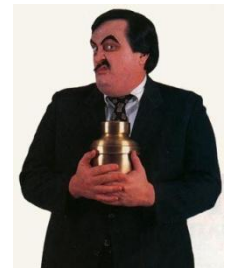

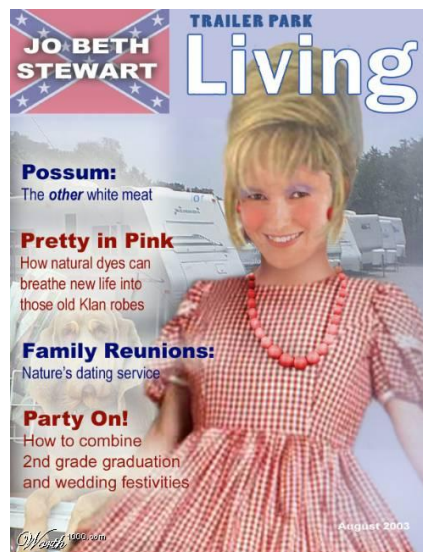
