SS SOUHEY LAUNCHED AGAIN TO HELP CLEAN THE LAKES AND PONDS

Mayor Alton J. Souhey christened the re-launching of the floating muck scooper "SS Souhey" at Echo Lake. The vessel was purchased by a local environmental group and donated last year to the city to help eradicate lake scum and improve fishing of carp and catfish. The boat accidentally sank in shallow water when then mayor took it out for a fishin party.

The vessel built by Bubba's Mobile Home and Marine Recreation Center in nearby Fletcher. The vessel has a control / living cabin with 40 gallon insulated beer cooler, a skimming platform annd 20 hp outboard motor. The vessel will be able to be on the lake and operate 8 hours a day during the spring, summer and fall months unless it springs a leak or gets bogged down in the muck.

"We hope to get the muck out of the lake in 3 or 4 years," said Souhey. "It's a tedious process and our scoop is not that big," he said.

DOWNTOWN STREET REPAIR AND PATCHING AHEAD OF SCHEDULE

Good weather kept the downtown street repair project ahead of schedule. "We're at least 3 weeks ahead of schedule so far due to the warm dry weather" said Malcom Skidmore, assistant project



manager. "With any luck at all, we'll be able to patch up the holes by the end of August just before the gas company comes along and digs up the streets again", he said.

CITY MANAGER ANNOUNCES CUTS AND ADDITIONAL TAXES



City Manager Virgil Tinzley presented a sad financial scenario to the city commissioners in a recent meeting at City Hall.

"Due to the decreasing income taxes coming into the city, we need to make several budgetary and tax adjustments and we are on course to lose approximately

\$1.5 million dollars in revenue" Tinzley said. "We will need to cut several positions, out-source some services and increase taxes just to balance the budget" he stated.

The following recommendations to out-source, reduction in services and / or elimination were made:

- Building Inspection
- Septic tank inspection
- Front yard junk inspection
- Bar / Alcohol enforcement
- Police and fire departments will not work weekends
- Health department inspection
- Trash collection

Recommendations for taxation to include:

- Assessment for more than one car on blocks in the front yard.
- Assessment for more than two refrigerators on the front porch.
- Air pollution thru belching and farting tax.
- Assessment for more than 3 tires on a vehicle.

- Assessment for more than 1 Sears catalog in the outhouse.
- Assessment for more than two trips daily to the liquor store. (This tax to be applied at the store for repeat offenders.)

CITIZENS URGED TO DONATE

City Manager Virgil Tinzley informed the Wrinkle City council that pothole repair will continue do to the excessive amount.
Citizens are urged to report large sections to be filled as soon as possible.



"We've filled the obvious holes in town so motorists can travel safely" said supervisor Melvin Gitt. "The object is to get to them before they become a big nuisance as they are a real SOB to fix. It seems we are fixing potholes on top of potholes" he said.

As materials expensive and supplies are getting low, Virgil Tinzley is asking all Wrinklecitians to donate used asphalt and spare cold patch to the city. These can be placed in the payment night deposit box at city hall. Pieces are to be no larger than 2 inches wide and 4 inches long. Large bags of cold patch can be delivered to the city manager's office.

HAPPY BUNZ CLOTHING OPTIONAL SOCIETY FINALLY OPENS

The Happy Bunz Clothing Optional Society is finally open!


The mortician asked, 'How can you tell?'

Gomer continued, "Yup, we never seen 'em, but, everybody used to say: 'There's Stanley with them two arse-holes.'"


