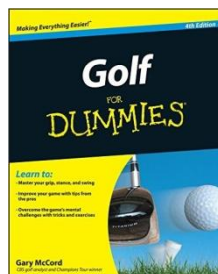
HAPPY BUNZ TO HOST NEKKID 'N AFRAID CAST AND CREW

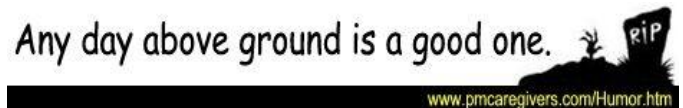

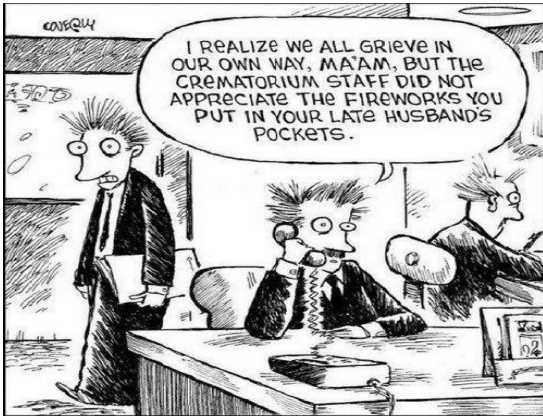


Burial Plans

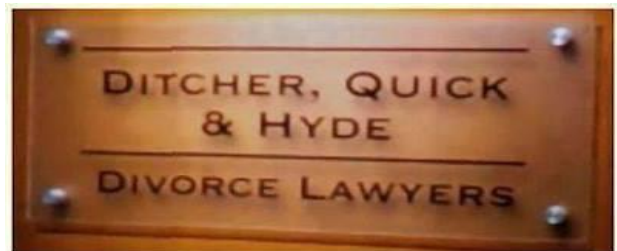
